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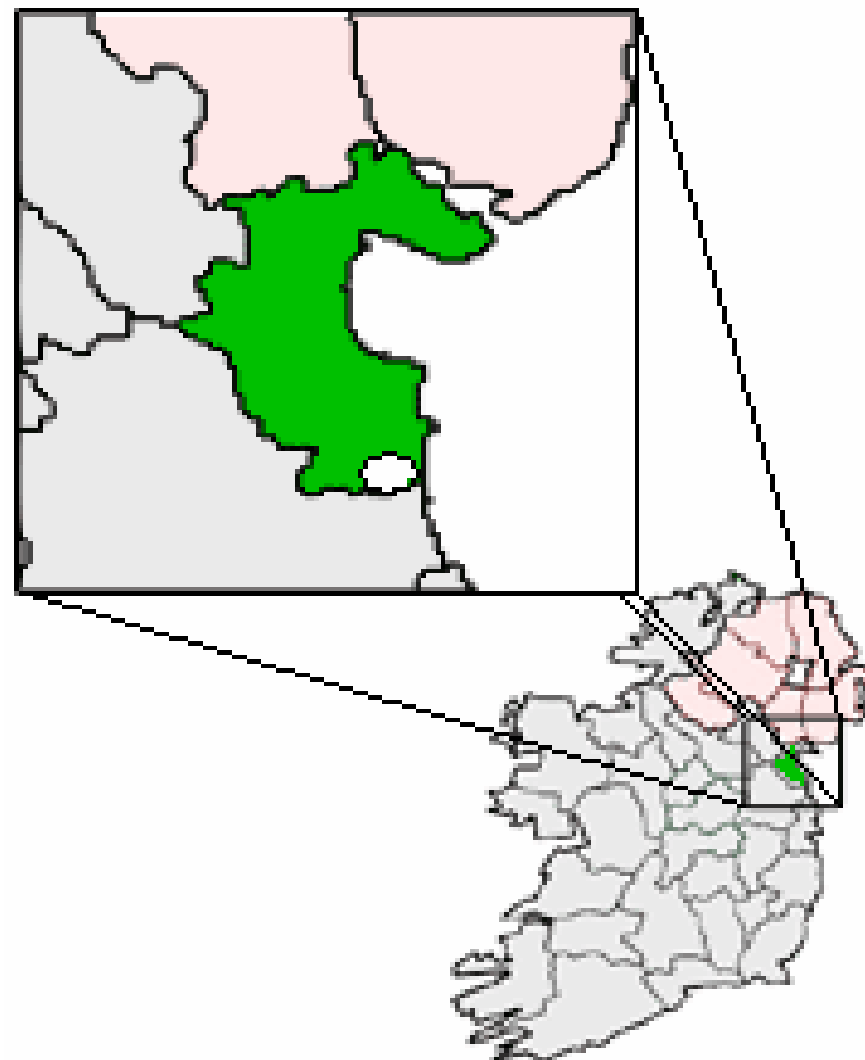

# The Study

- Recorded 3 adolescent males from a secondary school in Drogheda. The informants are have lived in Drogheda all their lives and have parents from Drogheda.
- Read a list of words with 5 repetitions for each word
- Words were put in the carrier sentence 'say ----- again'
- Sound files were transferred to a computer.
- The vowels were analyzed using PRAAT software



# Well's Lexical Sets

- Wells's *Accents of English* (1982) introduced the **lexical sets**.
- Wells categorizes accents based on their vocalic system.
- A **lexical set** consists of a group of words which have the same realisation of a certain vowel in a certain variety.

KIT: /ɪ/ : *kit, hit, physics*

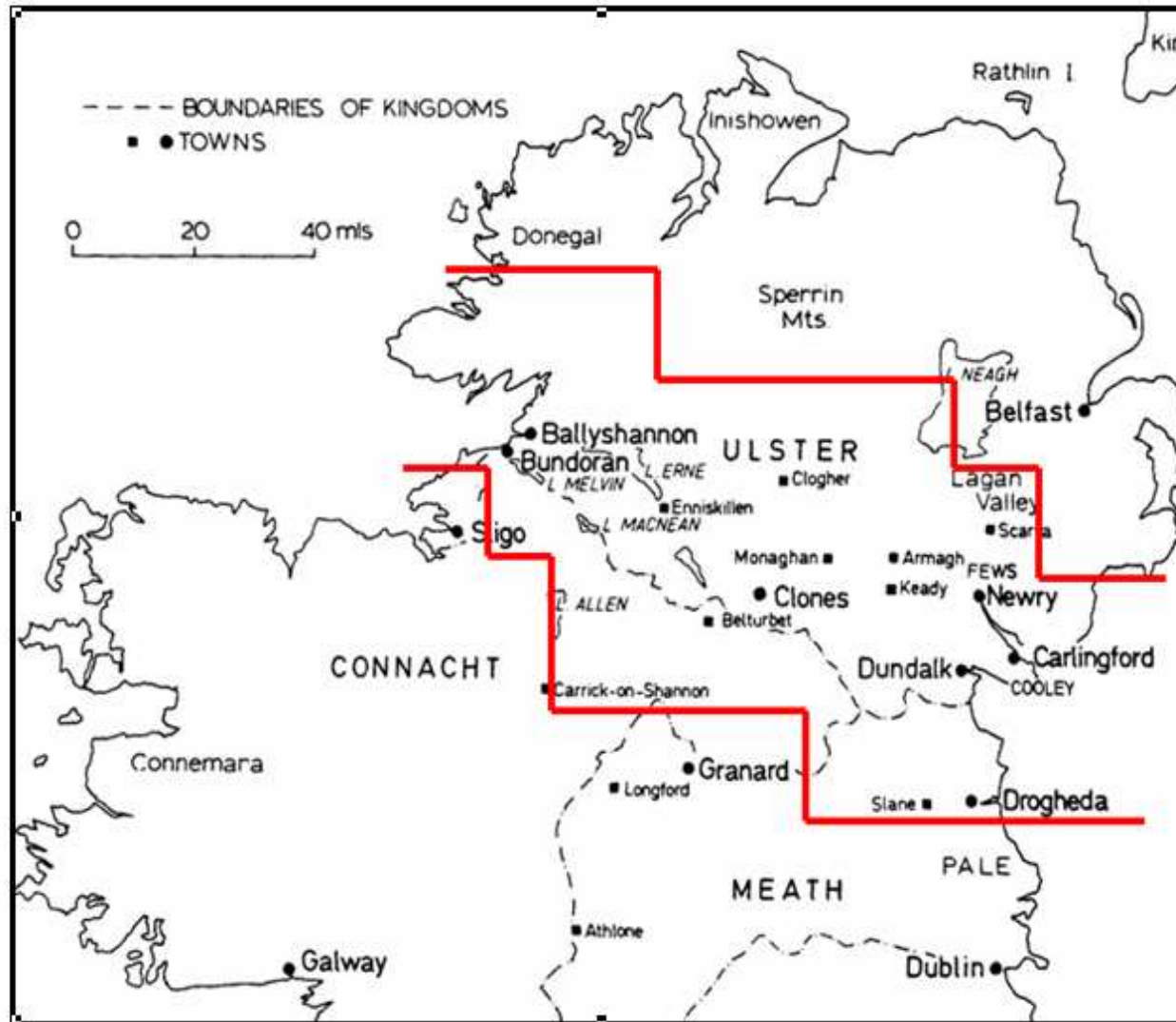
DRESS: /ɛ/: *dress, many, head*

GOOSE: /u:/: *goose, school, who*

MOUTH: /aʊ/: *mouth, how, doubt*

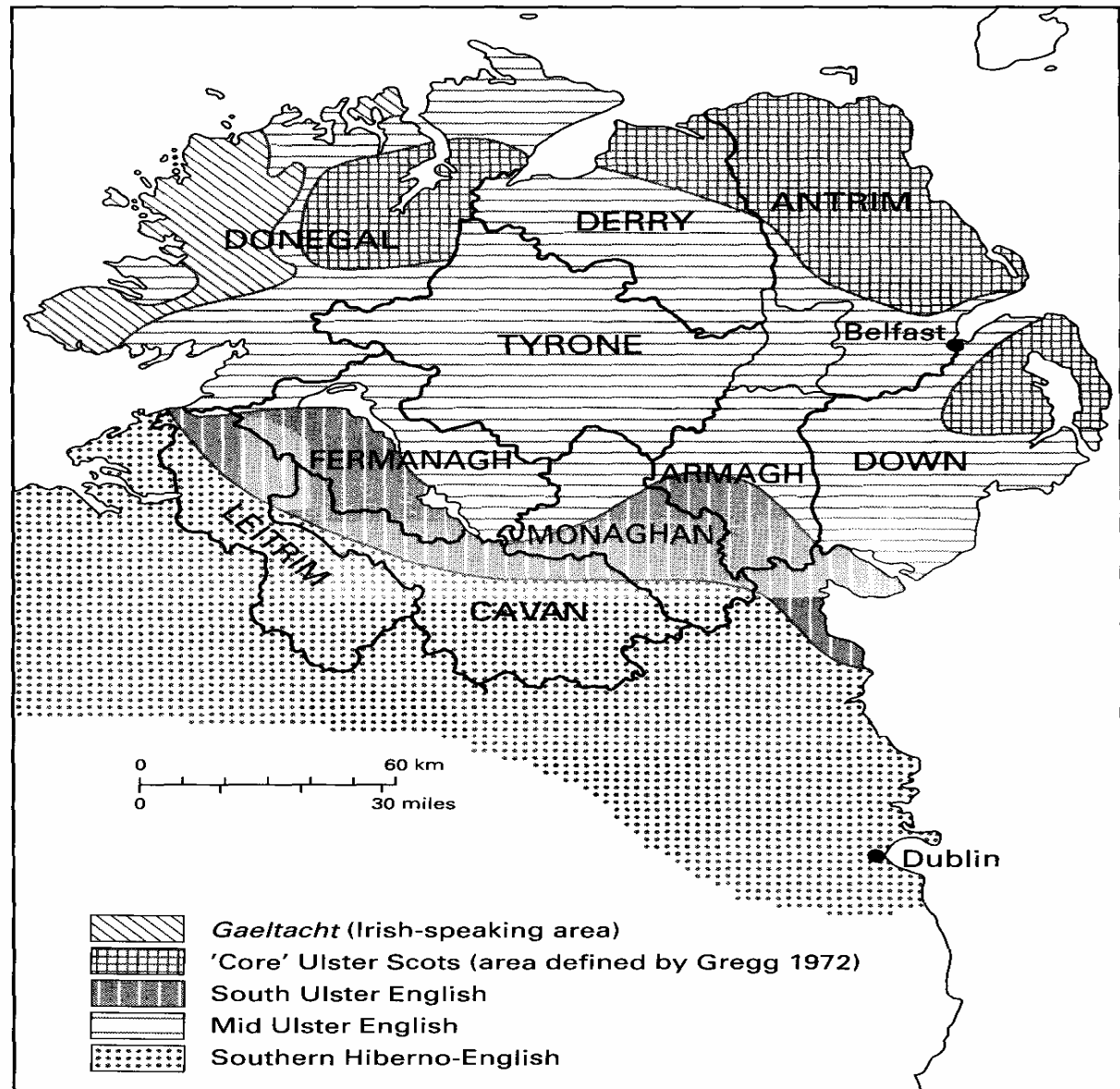

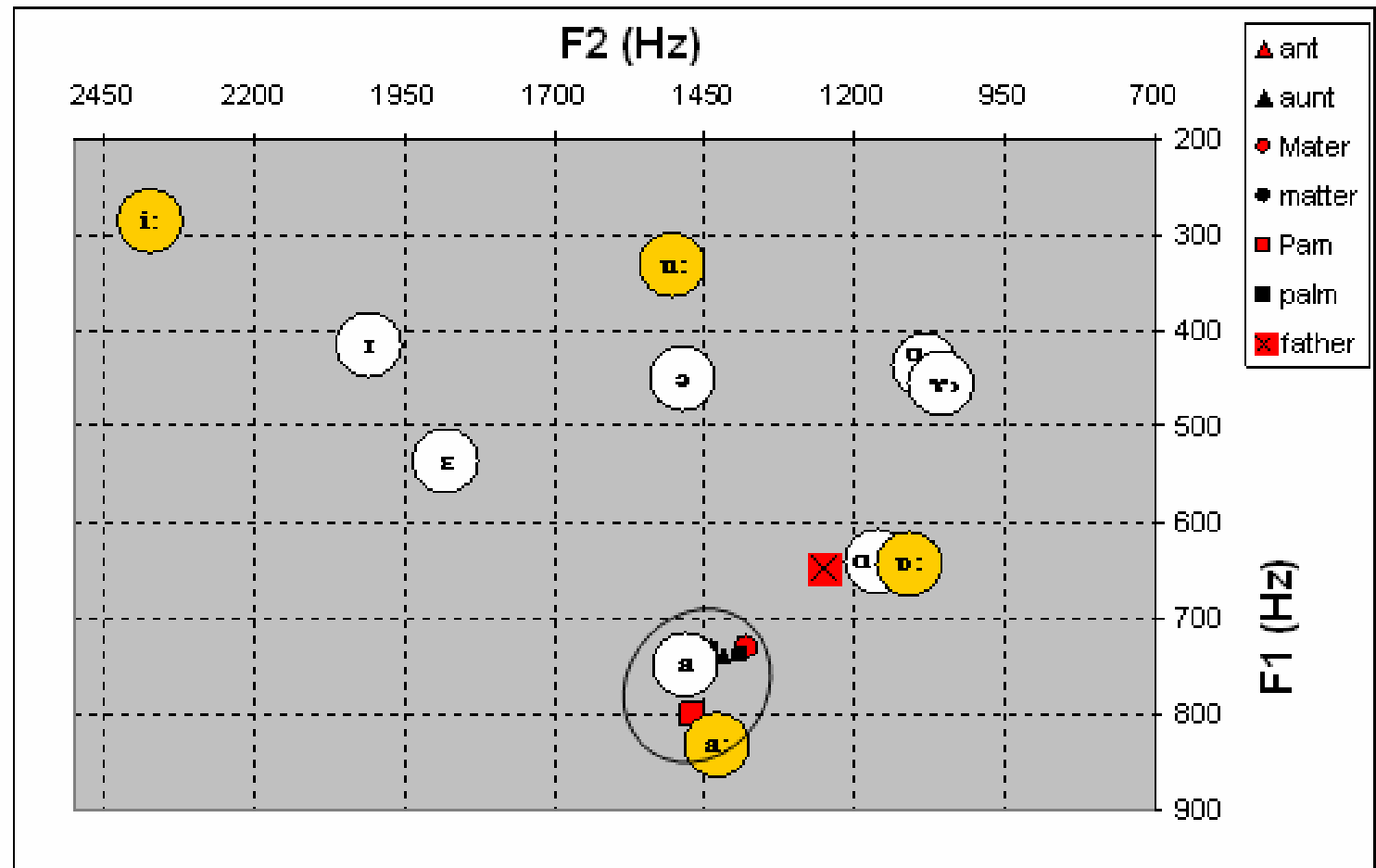
### Average Durations of Monophthongs (ms)





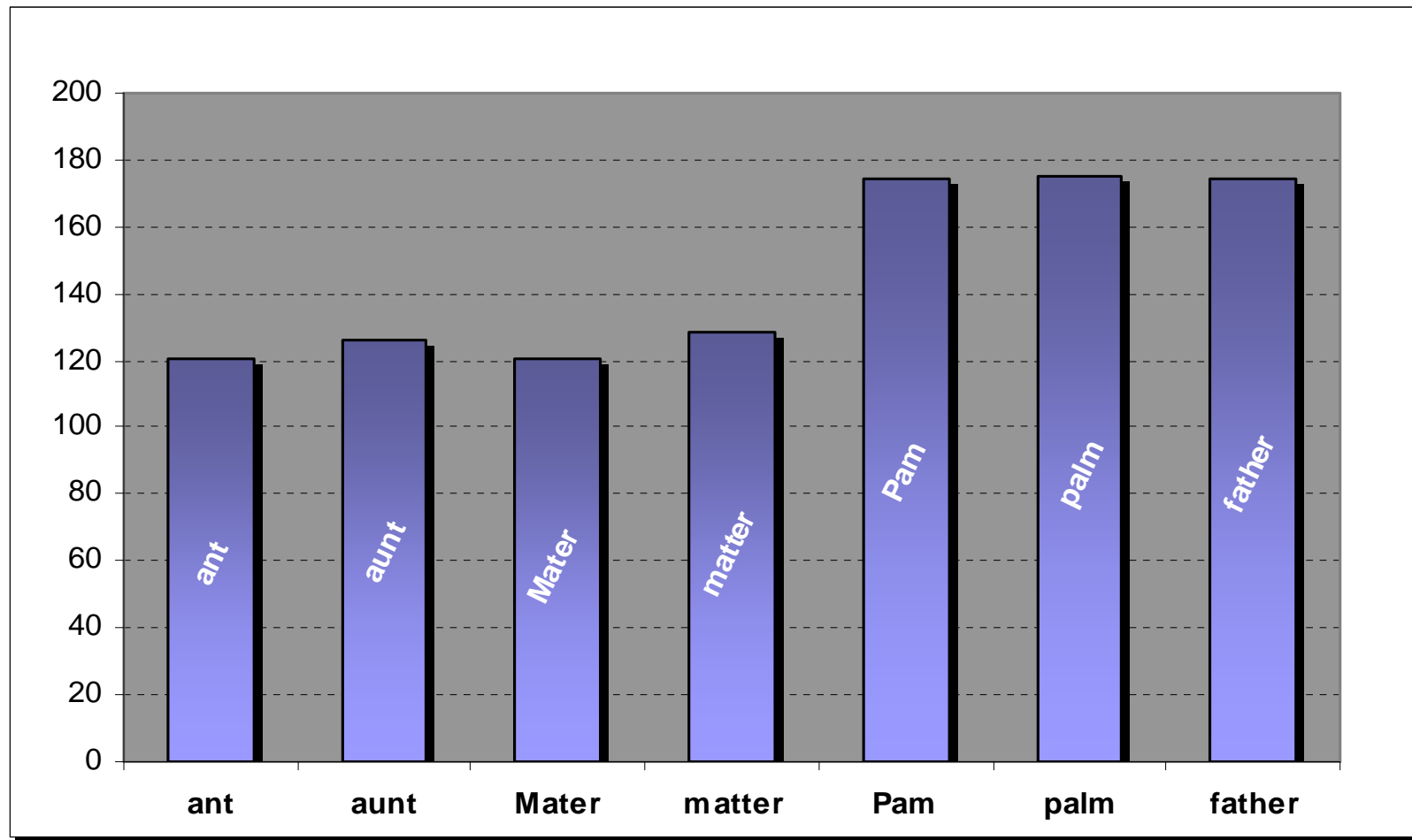

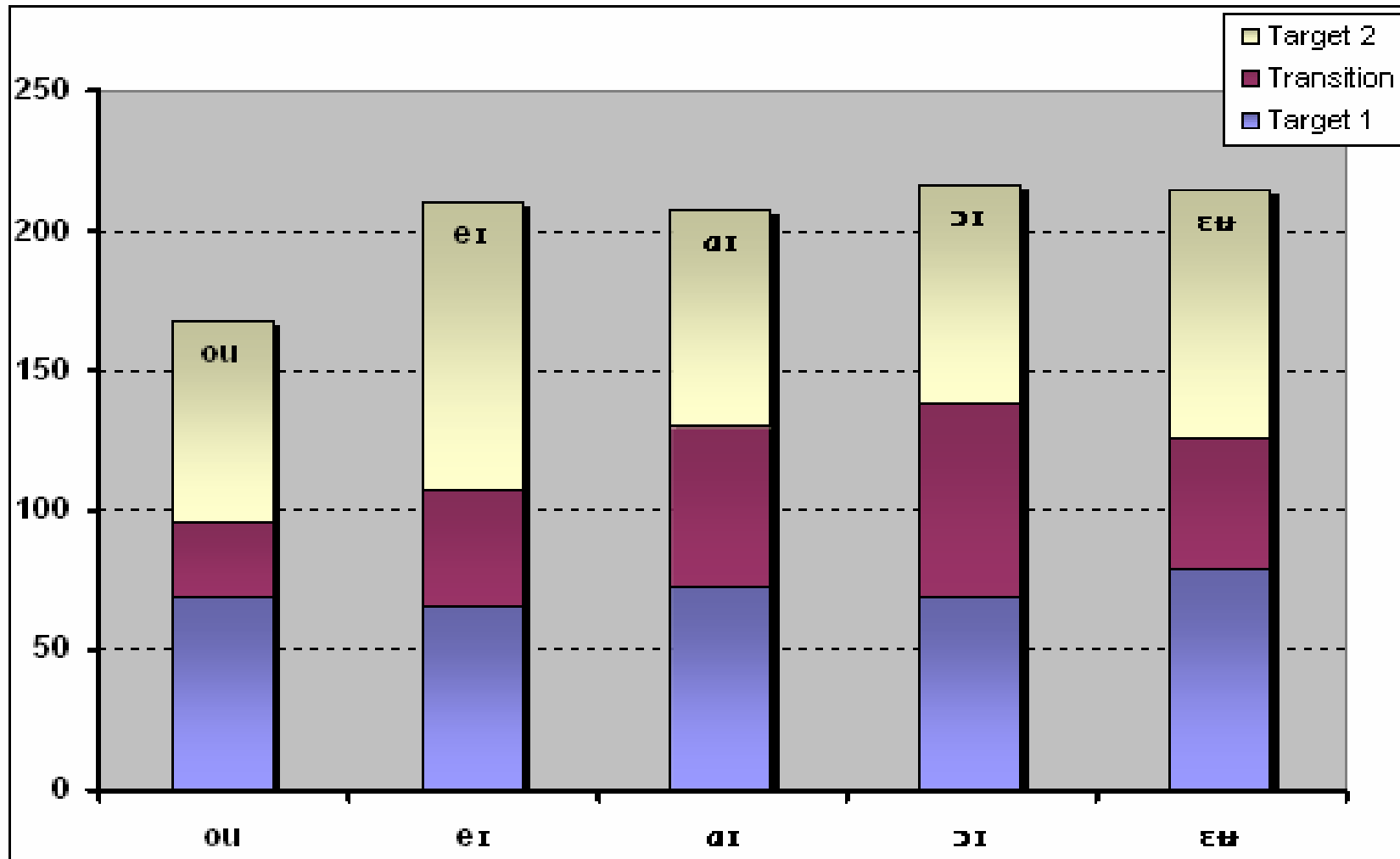


# Diphthongs Trajectories





# Diphthongs Average Durations (ms)



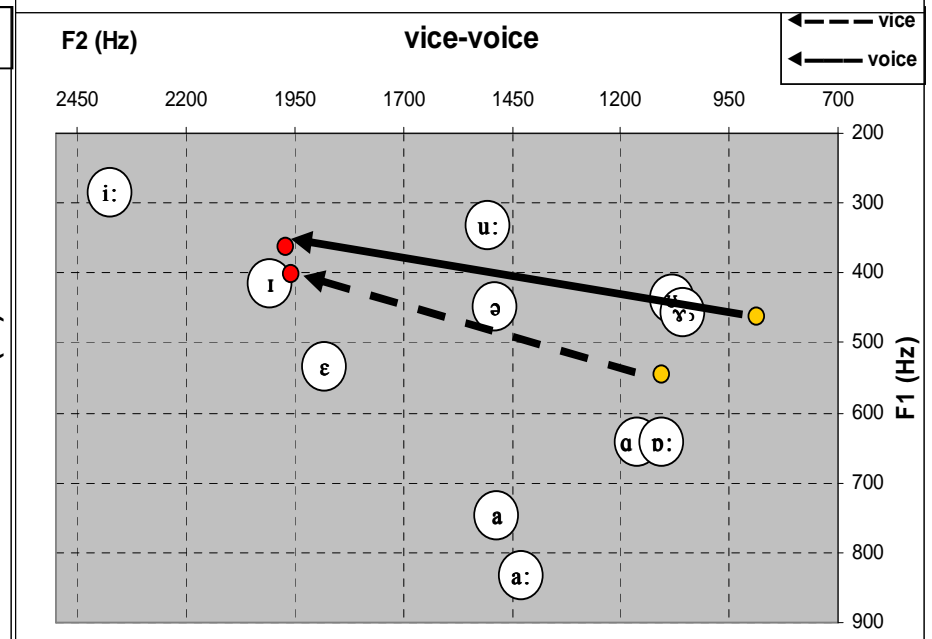
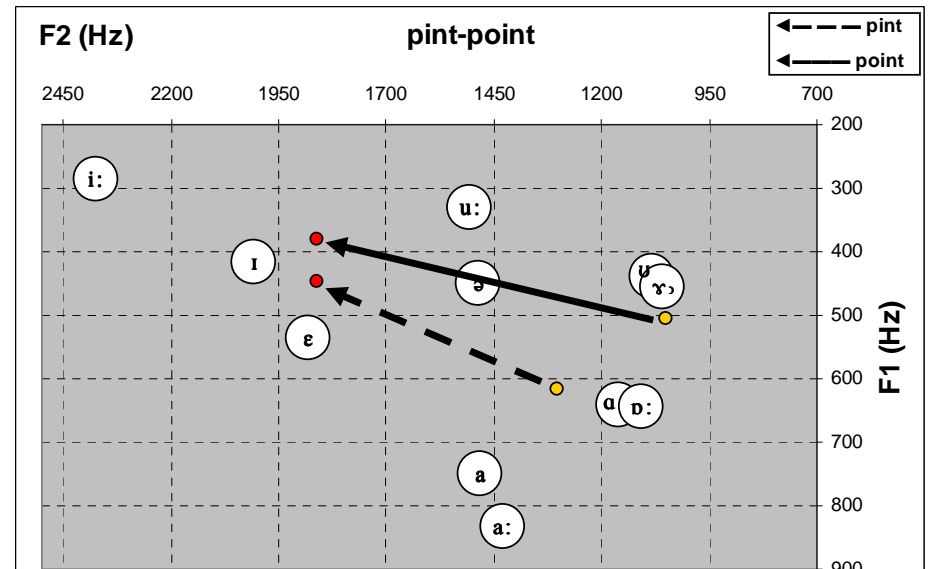
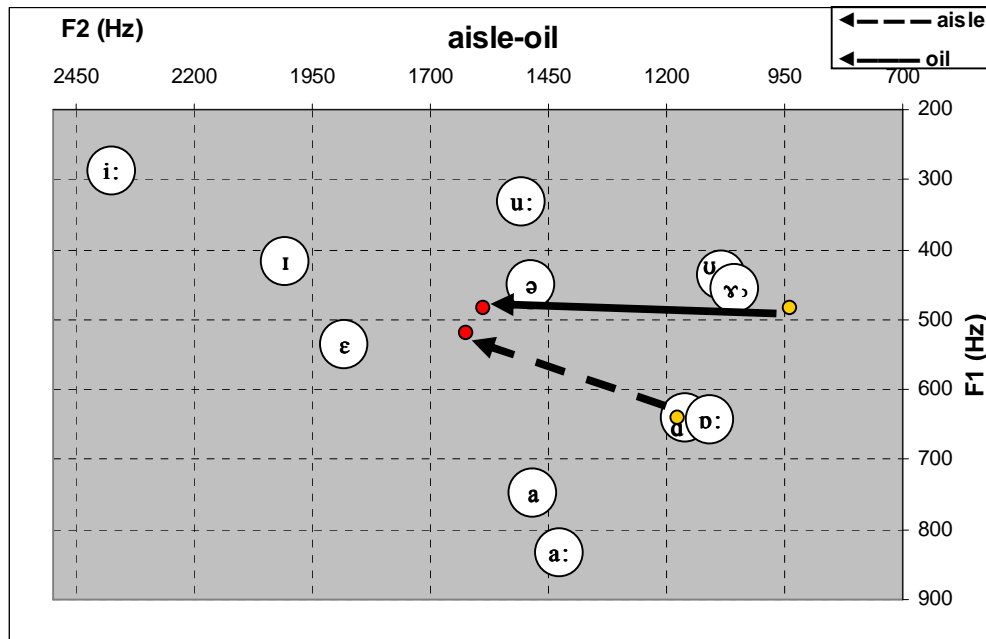
