

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#### The Study

- Read a list of words with 5 repetitions for each word
- Words were put in the carrier sentence 'say ---- again'
- Sound files were transferred to a computer.
- The vowels were analyzed using PRAAT software

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#### Well's Lexical Sets

- Wells's Accents of English (1982) introduced the lexical sets.
- Wells categorizes accents based on their vocalic system.
- A lexical set consists of a group of words which have the same realisation of a certain vowel in a certain variety.

KIT: / I / : kit, hit, physics




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### **Diphthongs Trajectories**
