GENERAL COURSE INFORMATION

During the academic year the Department expect you to:

Russian and Slavonic Studies Course Content

Our courses are aimed at beginners; advanced learners can also be accommodated on full degrees. In all years, the Department provides intensive study of the Russian language, Literature and Culture through a variety of modules. Final-year students will study a range of literature and culture modules taught in small-group, seminar format. Final-year Trinity Joint Honours (TJH) students also write a Capstone project of 10,000 words on a topic of their choosing under the supervision of one the Department's lecturer. Our department offers:

- the only degree-level courses of Russian in Ireland
- option to study Polish, Ukrainian, Bulgarian, and Croatian
- small classes, personal attention, and assistance from native speakers at every step of the learning process.

Once a student is registered, they can view their timetable on their student portal. The onus is on students to check their timetable at regular intervals to identify any changes to venues or lecture times. It is imperative that students, at the beginning of the academic year, check for any clashing of modules that may be occurring, not just in Semester 1, but also in Semester 2. Registration of JF Students on SF Pathways for Academic Year 2024-2025

At the end of your Junior Fresh year, Joint Honours students will be invited during Trinity term to select their Senior Fresh pathway. Students will be advised of how to register several weeks in advance of registration. Timetabling may restrict the availability of modules to individual students.

Junior Fresh Joint Honours students must choose between the following options for their Senior Fresh year:²

- Continue to take both subjects that they currently take (20 ECTS + 20 ECTS) and 20 credits of Trinity Electives & Open Modules.
- Take Subject 1 as a Major and Subject 2 as a Minor.
- Take Subject 2 as a Major and Subject 1 as a Minor.
- Take one Subject only and 20 credits of Trinity Electives & Open Modules. Students who select this pathway for Senior Fresh will be on track to exit with a Single Honours degree and must spend a compulsory year abroad in their Junior Sophister year.

Capstone Project

What is a Capstone project? This is an independent piece of work that you will undertake in your Senior Sophister year. It is worth 20 ECTS. Please be aware that prerequisites or module requirements may apply. Please read this Capstone Requirements per TJH Subject. Your pathway will determine which subject your Capstone is in.

Single Honours Pathway - Students will complete a Capstone project in the subject of the Single Honours award.

Major with Minor Pathway - Students will complete a Capstone project in the Major subject of their degree award.

Joint Honours Pathway - Students can choose which of their two subjects they wish to complete their Capstone project in. You should have already selected your Capstone subject in Year 3.

Coursework Requirements

The Department of Russian and Slavonic Studies uses a variety of modes of assessment. Detailed information concerning the assessment and reassessment of modules is included in module descriptors available through the student portal. Your lecturer will also provide details of submission dates for assessed coursework and oral presentations at the beginning of each term. If you have any questions regarding the assessment arrangements for a specific module, you should contact your module coordinator.

Students are required to submit all essays through **Turnitin on Blackboard**. All essays must also be accompanied by a **signed coversheet** provided on Blackboard. Essays must adhere to a

recognized referencing system. Your module instructor will inform you if a specific referencing system is to be used.

In is essential that all coursework is submitted on time. Essays submitted after the due date without permission will be subject to the penalties set out in the School handbook. Please note that these penalties have been agreed and are applied throughout the School of Languages, Literatures and Cultural Studies. Extensions may be granted only where there is a medical certificate or evidence of other mitigating circumstances. Evidence must be presented through your Tutor. It is each student's personal responsibility to comply with the assessment requirements and submission. The School Handbook includes details of College's Plagiarism Policy as well as links to the Library Guides on avoiding plagiarism and the declaration text used for submitting assignments. The School also has a policy on the late submission of coursework. If there is a local policy on referencing or a departmental copy of the Plagiarism declaration, please include the relevant links here.

Capstone Project

The Capstone project in the Department of Russian and Slavonic Studies is an independent research project on a topic chosen in consultation with a departmental staff member who will act as supervisor. Detailed guidelines on the Capstone project will be circulated to students during the Trinity term of their JS year. Prizes Awarded in the Department of Russian and Slavonic Studies

W.H.B. GREENWOOD MEMORIAL PRIZE

This prize was founded in 1998 by a bequest from Winifred Greenwood, lecturer in the Department of Russian 1962-89, and its Head until 1987. It is awarded to the **Sophister student** who achieves the highest assessment (of at least a good second class (first division) standard) in a one- or two-semester module, or dissertation in the fields of Russian literature or cultural studies. **Value**, **€195**.

JULIAN A. KAMENSKY PRIZE FOR ORAL RUSSIAN

This prize, in memory of Julian A. Kamensky who taught in the Department of Russian 1968-75, was founded in 1986 by a gift from two anonymous donors. It is offered annually to the **Senior Sophister** student who achieves the highest level of spoken Russian in the moderatorship part II examination. **Value**, €50.

C.B. ROBERTS MEMORIAL PRIZE

This prize was founded in 1992 in memory of Christopher Brooke Roberts, lecturer in the Department of Russian 1969-91. It is awarded to the **Sophister student** who achieves the highest assessment in an option in the fields of comparative Slavonic or Russian linguistics, or in the history of the Russian language. **Value**, **€95**.

COMPOSITION PRIZES IN MODERN LANGUAGES

Composition prizes are awarded each year to Junior and Senior Freshman students in the School of English (2 prizes), the Departments of French (6), Germanic Studies (6), Hispanic Studies (4), Irish and Celtic Languages (4), Italian (4), and Russian and Slavonic Studies (4), following two-subject moderatorship, European studies, computer science and language and single honour courses. If sufficient merit is shown, two additional prizes may be awarded in English and in French. One prize for composition in English is awarded to Sophisters. Value, €40 each. Each prize may be divided between students of equal merit.

Attendance Requirements

Attendance at all lectures, tutorials, and language classes, whether in person or online, is COMPULSORY for students in all years. In the case of absence of more than three consecutive days, a medical certificate or other relevant supporting evidence should be provided to the appropriate lecturer(s). In accordance with the regulations laid down by the University Council, students may be returned for the semester as *non-satisfactory* if they have been absent for more that a third of their course if study in any term. Students reported as non-satisfactory for the Michaelmas and Hilary terms of a given year may be refused permission to take their semester two assessment or examinations and may be required by the Senior Lecturer to repeat the year.

Requests for Transcripts and Letters of Recommendation

Transcripts can be requested from Academic Registry. These provide details of modules studied and marks attained. If you require further information that is not included in the official transcript, please contact undergraduate.sllcs@tcd.ie
