Administrative history

The papers of Brendan Kennelly arrived in the library in several different tranches, from varied provenances including Brendan Kennelly's rooms in the University, from his house in Ballylongford, and from the Kennelly family. It was accessioned over a decade; the first tranche came in around 2008-2009. A large tranche of material came in 2018 - 2022 from his family. Material was also accessioned from the English Department in 2021- 2023.

System of arrangement

On arrival this very large collection had no discernible arrangement. This present catalogue is concerned with literary material only. It has been organised as follows:

The first series is poetry (published collections followed by alphabetically arranged single items).

The second series comprises of his published plays.

The third series is novels and short stories.

The fourth series contains drafts and copies of his other work, such as reviews, articles, speeches, scripts for performances, talks and readings, essays,

appreciations and tributes for colleagues and other Irish literary and cultural figures and material relating to his work editing and compiling anthology's.
