1. Introduction

Trinity has always been committed to providing a distinctive education, which is inspired by current research and scholarship and delivered by academics with international reputations in their respective fields. Trinity Electives were developed under the Trinity Education Project and seek to build on this tradition and to link research and teaching in an innovative way. They are integral to the objectives of the Trinity Education.

Their purpose is to add breadth to the undergraduate curriculum by providing students with meaningful and distinctive learning experiences beyond their main discipline(s)/subject(s) and with opportunities to develop the Trinity Graduate Attributes. A number of the Trinity Electives are linked specifically to the Trinity research themes, while others address key societal challenges from a contemporary and/or historical perspective, or link with languages and cultures. All seek to connect student learning with our research activity and enable students to engage with the societal impact of research.

Trinity Electives are stand-alone modules, with no pre-requisites, which may be taken by undergraduate students from across the University in their 2nd and 3rd years.¹ They are weighted at 5 ECTS credits and are taught and assessed within one semester.

Trinity Electives enable multidisciplinary exploration and must adhere to the following principles that were approved by University Council in April 2017 (CL/16-17/150). They must:

- examine current and/or past critical issues using techniques and approaches from multiple disciplines;
- expose students to new domains of knowledge, methods of enquiry and epistemologies, and the wider implications/consequences of the challenge/topic;
- foster reflection, inquisitiveness, skills of analysis and critical thinking;
- engage students in learning opportunities in diverse/heterogeneous groups;
- > provide students with opportunities to develop the Trinity Graduate Attributes.

Trinity Electives are designed to take account of the following:

- The need to ensure meaningful engagement of students from multiple disciplines with the content at the appropriate intellectual level;
- The need for the Trinity Elective to be thematically coherent, i.e., not a series of 'show and tell' lectures or a sequence of multidisciplinary topics.

The delivery of Trinity Electives ensures that students:

- are exposed to a range of teaching, learning and assessment methods including innovative methods;
- take an active and self-regulated approach to their own learning.

All Trinity Electives incorporate blended delivery or are fully online.

¹ The are some exceptions to this, particularly in the Health Sciences, where the majority of students are unable to take Trinity Electives due to professional constraints.

2. Work of the Trinity Electives Sub-Committee

The Trinity Electives Sub-Committee was established in 2020/21 as a sub-committee of the Undergraduate Studies Committee. The membership during 2020/21 was:

The Trinity Elective Sub-Committee met on two occasions, once in Semester 1 and once in Semester 2, with a further meeting organised of the academic members only at the start of June 2021, to discuss the results achieved in the Trinity Electives.

A call for proposals did not go out ahead of 2020/21, however, four proposals were submitted to TESC for consideration. The TESC considered all proposals, guided by the Council approved principles and, through the Chair, provided proposal writers with detailed and constructive feedback. Following the receipt of amended proposals, two were recommended to progress onwards for approval by USC and Council to run in 2021/22. These were, 'The Psychology of the Climate Crisis' and 'Black Studies'.

3. Capacities

Available student capacity across all Trinity Elective in 2020/21 totalled 4,598 student places; 1,854 in Semester 1 and 2,744 in Semester 2. Enrolment figures were 1,480 for Semester 1 and 1,426 for Semester 2.

This meant that 20% of places were unfilled in Semester 1 and 48% were unfilled in Semester 2. Sufficient capacity needed to be available for students on legacy programmes eligible to take Broad Curriculum modules, many of whom took these on an optional basis. It was difficult to predict the take-up level from students taking Trinity Electives instead of Broad Curriculum modules. The academic year 2021/22, should see the last cohorts of students accessing these modules in lieu of Broad Curriculum modules.

Demand for places on Trinity Electives in 2021/22 is likely to have reached its peak, with all Phase 2 TEP courses reaching their third year of delivery. Students make pathway choices at the end of JF year for the SF year, and at the end of the SF year for their Sophister years. It was difficult to plan for this year's capacity requirements during 2020/21, as there was no data available on JS year pathway patterns to analyse and no report to help predict the number of students on pathways eligible to take Trinity Electives. It is hoped that a report will be developed during 2021/22 for this purpose, now that there is fuller data available on JS student pathway choices in SITS.

In 2020/21, a total of 39 Trinity Electives were on offer to students, including an Elective run by the National College of Art and Design. Several of the language modules ran at both beginners and advanced levels and a significant number of modules across the suite were offered in both semesters.

5. Breakdown of numbers taking Trinity Electives

In 2020/21, a further set of 13 Trinity Electives were rolled out for delivery, adding to the first set of 26. Students used an online application system in SITS to apply for Trinity Electives by listing their preferred modules in a ranked order of preference. The online selection and allocation system was built under the project, Digital Trinity 1 (DT1), in consultation with the Trinity Electives Subgroup (the forerunner to the Trinity Electives Sub-Committee). The academic lead for the Trinity Electives under TEP, Prof Declan O'Sullivan, and the Chair of the Trinity Electives Subgroup, Prof Áine Kelly provided the academic requirements to DT1 and signed off on the allocation algorithm. Places were allocated using this algorithm and the allocation was reviewed and signed off by Profs O'Sullivan and Kelly before being communicated to students. In Semester 1 of 2020/21, 80% of students were allocated their first preference module and 13% were allocated their second choice. In Semester 2, 73% received their first choice, with 21% of students allocated their second preference. Visiting students (year-long and Semester 1 students) had an opportunity to select from the remaining places before the start of the academic year. Those visiting for Semester 2 were able to select from remaining Trinity Electives in January 2021.

Information was provided to students via a Trinity Electives website. Each Trinity Elective hosts a pitch video, general information and more detailed information for those that wish to explore further - see www.tcd.ie/trinity-electives.

The total uptake of Trinity Electives by students in 2020/21 was 1,480 in Semester 1 and 1426 in Semester 2, totalling 2,906. The number of students enrolled on each module is set out in Tables 2 and 3 below.

6. Student survey - high-level results

A student survey was compiled for the purposes of getting feedback from students on their experience of taking Trinity Electives, from the perspective of their discipline, and to ensure that the overall quality of the offering is maintained.

It is managed by the Quality Office and disseminated to all students taking Trinity Electives in each Semester. Responses are voluntary and remain anonymous. Module Coordinators were also free to carry out their own in-class surveys to get specific feedback on their Electives.

The response rate to the survey in Semester 1 2020/21 was 23% (339 students) and in Semester 2 was 19% (273 students). This compares with 24% (285 students) in Semester 1 and 13% (273 students) in Semester 2 in 2019/20.

Findings across Semester 1 and Semester 2 in 2020/21 were positive in terms of responses to the question on whether students had the opportunity to bring insights from their own discipline to their work in the Elective: 71% of respondents (194) *'agreed or somewhat agreed'* that they could bring insights from their discipline to their TE Module in Semester 2 compared to 62% (211) in Semester 1.

Findings across Semester 1 and Semester 2 were generally consistent in terms of the opportunity to learn from peers (S1: 68.5% (232); S2: 64.5% (176)). And in in Semester 2, the findings for whether '*Overall, taking this module was a valuable experience*' show a proportionate increase of 8.5% on Semester 1 (S2: 77.5% (212); S1 69% (234)) of respondents.

7. Module Coordinators' Experiences

Two feedback sessions were held for Module Coordinators as 13 new Trinity Elective modules were delivered during 2020/21. In December 2020, a session was held for Semester 1 module coordinators to share their experiences with Semester 2 module co-ordinators. A second session was held in April 2021. Apart from providing new Trinity Elective module coordinators with information from those who had already delivered their Trinity Elective, these meetings provide module co-ordinators with a sense of belonging to a Trinity Elective 'community' and an informal session in which to share and learn from others' experiences. Feedback from module coordinators was in general extremely positive, with those delivering Electives finding that they benefitted from the experience of delivering to a multi-disciplinary cohort of students.

Due to Covid-19 restrictions in 2020/21, these sessions took place online.

8. Assessment results

The process for ratifying Trinity Electives marks at Courts of Examiners was initially approved by USC in April 2019 and updated in February 2020, as part of mainstreaming plans for Trinity Electives, as follows:

(i) the scrutinising of marks by a marks review panel consisting of a minimum of 3 academics including the Module Coordinator before inputting to SITS,

- (ii) the review of marks by a Trinity Electives Review Committee, consisting of the Chair of the Trinity Electives Sub-Committee, along with its other academic members, and
- (iii) the provision of anonymised results data from the Trinity Electives Review committee will be made available to Courts of Examiners in each programme so that they have sight of overall student performance in Electives that students within their courses have taken.

Reports were compiled in May 2021 and in September 2021 (for reassessments/deferrals) for meetings of the Trinity Electives Review Committee and for circulation ahead of meetings of Courts of Examiners to give context to the Trinity Elective marks. The report set out:

- Visual representation of (i) final marks, (ii) distribution of grades, (iii) minimum/maximum grades by Faculty, and (iv) overall grade distribution by Faculty;
- Semester 1 average grades, minimum and maximum and Grade Distribution by Faculty all modules
- Semester 2 average grades, minimum and maximum and Grade Distribution by Faculty module results received to date.

Module Coordinators were available for queries regarding their Trinity Electives and their details provided.

Due to Covid-19 mitigating measures put in place for students, which included the extension of the assessment period in May to accommodate a large number of deferring students from Semester 1, and the automatic right to a deferral of Semester 2 assessments, a number of individual student results were delayed and certain data in the Courts of Examiners reports were being skewed by marks of 0% corresponding to the module grades of PD, AR, AB and NA. To avoid this, the background formulas were adjusted to prevent marks corresponding to these grades from feeding into the figures for the average and minimum marks, and the standard deviation. Please see Appendices A & B.

9. Support of Trinity Electives

In February 2020, Council approved the 'Proposal for Mainstreaming of Trinity Electives: Academic and Operational' (appended to USC minutes of 21 January 2021). The document put forward recommendations related to the academic governance and administration of the Trinity Electives from 2020/21, following the close-out of the Trinity Education Project and its associated office. These recommendations included the establishment the Trinity Electives Sub-Committee, reporting into USC, and plans for certain operational arrangements, including those for timetabling, and the student selection and allocation processes.

Whilst this document established an appropriate academic governance structure and covered arrangements for wide range of operational tasks which take place on an annual basis, a key gap identified during 2020/21, was the lack of a main administrative home for Trinity Electives to co-ordinate operational activities and to answer queries. To help address the latter issue, the Administrative Officer from Academic Affairs (in Trinity Teaching and

Learning) created a webpage on the Trinity Elective website aimed at staff, to help respond to the most frequent queries. However, with the conclusion of the Digital Trinity 2 (DT2) project, and the transfer of responsibility for the Trinity Electives functionality in SITS to the Academic Registry, it would be timely to re-look at administrative processes and responsibilities to create a more co-ordinated operational structure around Trinity Electives.

If College wishes to refresh its Trinity Elective offering periodically and to continue to offer students new attractive offerings, another area which needs to be addressed is the identification of funding into the future. New Trinity Electives currently receive start-up funding from a small sum of residual Trinity Education Project funding. Sufficient funding was available for the two new Electives approved during 2020/21, however, at the current rate of seed funding allocation, this is due to run out with the approval of the next three new modules.

10. Conclusion

The second year of the delivery of the Trinity Electives has, again, been a major achievement and the commitment of the academic staff that submitted proposals is acknowledged with thanks. It would not have been possible without the dedication and enthusiasm with which Module Coordinators met the task of delivering their Trinity Electives, particularly during very difficult and uncertain times, during the lockdown caused by the Covid-19 pandemic. Also acknowledged here, with thanks, are the efforts of the Trinity Electives Sub-Committee, Academic Registry, IT Services, DT2, Trinity Online Services, Academic Affairs, the Undergraduate Common Architecture Office and School Administrative Managers, without whom the second year of the Trinity Electives delivery would not have succeeded. There have been many benefits – to the students who have access to a suite of modules that are wideranging, challenging, and innovative in their approach; to the academic staff delivering them who have the opportunity to showcase their research, and to engage with academic staff and students from other disciplines bring with them different perspectives; and to the University as a whole.

As this programme enters its third year in 2021/22, it is timely to draw on learnings from its first two years. Care needs to be taken in this early stage, following the conclusion of the Trinity Education Project, to continue to support and embed the delivery of Trinity Electives if it is to become, and remain, a flagship feature of a distinctive undergraduate Trinity Education. One that is attractive to prospective students, both national and international, and enriching for those already enrolled.

The report sets out:


- The list of all Trinity Electives and their module codes.


