**Minutes of Board Meeting 23 October 2019**

**SECTION A**

**BD/19-20/034 Statement of Interest**

The Secretary to the College advised that he had received a statement of potential conflict of interest from Professor Brennan in respect of agenda item A.10 Visitors. With the agreement of Professor Brennan, he suggested and it was agreed that Professor Brennan would leave the room for the discussion on this item.

The Provost advised that there was a potential conflict of interest for the Chief Operating Officer, the College Secretary, the Interim Treasurer/Chief Financial Officer and the Senior Tutor in respect of agenda item C.20 Dining Rights at Commons. With their agreement, he proposed, and it was agreed, that these Board members would leave the room for the discussion on this item.

**BD/19-20/035 Board Confidentiality**

The Secretary to the College, with reference to the Consolidated Statutes 2010, reminded Board members of the importance of maintaining the confidential nature of the Board and advised that under the Statutes the Provost is the spokesperson for the Board.

**BD/19-20/036 Death of the Chair of the Audit Committee**

The Provost advised Board members that the Chair of the Audit Committee, Mr Oliver Cussen had passed away. He proposed, and it was agreed, that the Secretary to the College would write to Mr Cussen's family to convey the condolences of the Board.

**BD/19-20/037 Minutes**

The draft minutes of the meeting of Board of 11 September 2019 were approved and signed subject to a spelling correction in the Education Officer's name.

**BD/19-20/038 Matters Arising**

There were no matters arising.

**BD/19-20/039 Provost's Report**

*The Vice-Provost/Chief Academic Officer chaired the meeting for this item.*

At the invitation of the Vice-Provost/Chief Academic Officer, the Provost provided a report to the Board on his work programme for the year 2019/20 under the following headings:

- **Leadership of senior staff**

The Provost advised that he will continue to provide leadership and to work closely with the College Officers to deliver key strategic initiatives.

In particular, the Provost noted that he is working closely with the Vice-Provost/Chief Academic Officer and the Interim Treasurer/Chief Financial Officer to complete and launch the University's Strategic Plan. He was also working closely with the Vice-Provost/Chief Academic Officer on the Trinity Education Project (TEP) which is in its final phase and is due to be completed in 12 months. Work will also be required to establish the governance of the Charm EU Initiative.

The Provost advised that he would be working closely with the Bursar/Director of Strategic Innovation in respect of some significant capital projects, including the refurbishment of the Old Library, and that progress was being made in respect of the submission of a planning application and in determining the underpinning financial model. He would also be working with the Bursar/Director of Strategic Innovation to progress the fundraising activity and business plan for the Trinity St James's Cancer Institute (TSJCI). Other on-going capital projects include the refurbishment of the Rubrics and the Chief Steward's House, the E3 Learning Foundry and the expansion of the Law School. It was noted that work was also continuing in respect of improving signage across the campus.

By continuing to work closely with the Chief Operating Officer the Provost will oversee a review of the Commercial Revenue Unit and the development of a new strategy for commercial activities. The Provost will also be working closely with the Chief Operating Officer in respect of the TTEC Pre-Development Project which will be progressed according to the Board-approved business plan. The Provost advised that he, and the Dean of Research, are to also work with the Corporate Services Division and, in particular, Human Resources regarding academic hiring.

The Provost is working with the Interim Treasurer/Chief Financial Officer to oversee the financing of the major projects already noted. In addition, there is to be a review of the Baseline Budgeting Model (BBM) and on-going revisions to, and development of, the business cases for the main strategic projects which are currently on-going.

The Provost and the Registrar will be overseeing the election of the Chancellor of the University and will be actively involved in the induction of the new Chancellor. Both the Provost and the Registrar will also continue to progress sustainability initiatives across the university. It was noted that the Registrar is also Chair of the Revised Code of Governance Working Group.

It was noted that the Provost will continue to work closely with the Vice-President for Global Relations to support the delivery of the Global Relations Strategy 3 (GRS3) and that this would require visits to meet contacts overseas on the part of the Provost.

- **Engineering, Environment and Emerging Technologies (E3) Governance**

It is envisaged that a new governance and re-calibrated final business plan for E3 will be brought to the Board in Michaelmas Term 2019. It is also envisaged that the design brief for the E3 Research Institute will be completed with assistance from the Dean of Research. The Provost will also Chair Workstream 5 of TTEC Pre-Development Project.

- **Inspiring Generations**

The Provost advised that he will continue to progress the work of the Campaign Cabinet and the Provost's Council where potential projects will be considered for fundraising. He advised the Board that a philanthropic target of €400 million had been set and a commitment to 150,000 volunteer hours has also been set. In order to achieve these targets, the Provost will be actively engaged in many Alumni events both overseas and here in Ireland.

- **College Governance and Legislation**

It was noted that the Provost is a member of the Board Review Working Group and that he intends to assist in the preparation of reports for discussion by the Board in respect of the principles and competencies involved, the operation of sub-committees and principal committees and the proposed membership of the Board.

- **Public Affairs**

It was noted that the Provost will be the Chair of the IUA Council from January 2020 and he advised that he plans to place a continued focus on the level of research funding in Irish universities.

*Professor Phelan joined the meeting at this point.*

- **General Management of the College**

The Provost advised that he will continue to Chair meetings of the Board and Council in addition to meetings of the Finance Committee, the Executive Officers' Group and the various promotions committees.

The Vice-Provost/Chief Academic Officer thanked the Provost and opened the item for discussion and questions.

In response to comments from a Board member in respect of the refurbishment of the Old Library, the Bursar/Director of Strategic Innovation clarified that the current focus is on finalising a proposed design and submitting proposals to Dublin City Council by the end of the year. The importance of keeping staff in the Old Library informed of the proposals for the redevelopment was acknowledged and the Bursar/Director of Strategic Innovation advised that this has been done in so far as possible to date. The responsibility of the University to preserve the Old Library and its contents was also noted as was the possibility of seeking funding from international bodies, as suggested by a Board member.

Responding to comments from a Board member, the Provost advised that a review of the operations of Trinity Development and Alumni had been conducted and that appropriate actions have been taken to minimise the potential for any future cyber-attacks.

Support from the Postgraduate Students' Union for the Provost and his endeavours in respect of highlighting the research funding issue was also expressed.

The Vice-Provost/Chief Academic Officer thanked the Provost for his report and the Provost resumed as Chair of the meeting.

**BD/19-20/040 College Strategic Plan 2020-2025**

The Vice-Provost/Chief Academic Officer invited the Board's attention to his presentation, dated 23 October 2019, which had been circulated. He advised Board members that the revised plan wording had been discussed with the Fellows and is scheduled to be considered by the Executive Officers' Group later in the month. It will then be brought to Council and Board for approval. It is envisaged that the formal launch of the Plan will take place in early 2020.

Responding to comments from a Board member, the Provost noted that there are on-going discussions in the University and that all efforts will be made to reach an optimum student: staff ratio in the context of maintaining high educational standards. It was also acknowledged that growth in post-graduate offerings would facilitate a growth in staff numbers also.

Following comments from Board members, the decrease in State funding was noted as a contributor in the discussions regarding the make-up of the student population and the importance of maintaining the principles of a Trinity education was acknowledged.

*The Programme Manager, Ms Edwina Hegarty attended for this item.*

The Bursar/Director of Strategic Innovation introduced Ms Hegarty to Board members and invited her to provide the Board with the E3 Learning Foundry capital project update. She advised the Board that the membership of the E3 Capital Steering Committee was also before the Board for

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approval. Ms Hegarty invited the Board's attention to her presentation, dated 23 October 2019, which had been circulated. She provided the Board with an update on the progress with the project to date.

The Bursar/Director of Strategic Innovation informed the Board that by broadening the scope of the project slightly there was a significant opportunity to open-up the east-end of the campus.

In response to comments from Board members, the Bursar/Director of Strategic Innovation advised that the Independent Monitor had extensive construction expertise and summarised the valued student contribution to the project to date. She also noted that the timelines for the project were being closely monitored by the Programme Management Office and that the experience from recent capital projects was being applied in this case. The Bursar/Director of Strategic Innovation also clarified that the enabling works were required to prepare the site in advance of the delivery of the new building.

It was noted that the updated business case with details on student and staff numbers and programmes will be presented to a future meeting of the Board.

The Provost thanked Ms Hegarty and the Bursar/Director of Strategic Innovation for their contributions to the project to date and commended the work of the design team in envisioning an impressive building.

*Ms Hegarty left the meeting at this point.*

##### **Roles and Responsibilities of the Associate Vice-Provost for Equality, Diversity and Inclusion**

The Vice-Provost/Chief Academic Officer invited the Board's attention to his memorandum, dated 16 October 2019, which had been circulated. He advised Board members that following the recent approval by Board to create the new Associate Vice-Provost for Equality, Diversity and Inclusion, he now wished to provide Board members with an overview of the roles and responsibilities of this position. The Vice-Provost/Chief Academic Officer summarised the main responsibilities of the new officership noting that it is a very important appointment which will provide visible and sustained advocacy for equality across the University.

Following comments from Board members, the Vice-Provost/Chief Academic Officer clarified that the Associate Vice-Provost for Equality, Diversity and Inclusion will be supported by a restructured and strengthened Equality Office. He also advised that the recruitment competition for the Equality Officer, who will report to the Associate Vice-Provost for Equality, Diversity and Inclusion, was underway and that discussions were on-going with the Director of TCGEL regarding how best to continue to draw on the expertise of those working there. The Provost, noting the significance of this appointment, clarified that the Associate Vice-Provost for Equality, Diversity and Inclusion can attend meetings of the Executive Officers' Group at her discretion.

In response to concerns expressed by a Board member in respect of gender-based initiatives, the Vice-Provost/Chief Academic Officer clarified that the process of approving the new officership had been expediated to strengthen the applications being made by Trinity to the Senior Academic Leadership Initiative (SALI) Call 2019. He also observed that the senior management of the University is currently gender balanced. Following further comments from the Board member, the Provost advised that it is envisaged that preparation of the Equality Monitoring Report and collation of the relevant data will progress much more quickly now that this new structure is in place. He also advised that an increase in support for the Athena SWAN process would now be available to all those across the University.

In response to comments from Board members, it was agreed that as soon as feasible, the Associate Vice-Provost for Equality, Diversity and Inclusion is to be invited to present to the Board.

He advised the Board that the Board Review Working Group will have its first meeting in the coming weeks and that Dr Sinead Ryan, former Director of Internationalisation in Trinity, will act in an advisory capacity to support the Chair and the work of the Group.

In response to comments from a Board member in respect of the proposed changes being contrary to the University's best interests, the Provost advised that all submissions made to Government in respect of the proposed changes to legislation would be available to view on the website of the Department of Education and Skills.

**BD/19-20/045 Trinity Technology and Enterprise Campus (TTEC): Update on the Acquisition of a Property**

*The Director of Campus Infrastructure, Mr Mike Clark joined the meeting for this item.*

Mr Clarke, with reference to his presentation, dated 23 October 2019, which had been circulated, provided the Board with an overview of the recent activities in respect of the TTEC Pre-Development Project. He advised the Board that it is proposed that Trinity purchase a site at Grand Canal Quay and detailed the mechanism by which this could be achieved. It was noted that this acquisition would also improve the rights of way situation on the site. He also advised that full legal due diligence had been undertaken and a risk assessment had been conducted.

In response to comments from Board members, the Interim Treasurer/Chief Financial Officer advised that the proposed structure for the acquisition had been carefully considered from a financial and legal perspective. He also clarified that there is a potential to acquire the last neighbouring property which would be beneficial for the University. The Chief Operating Officer also noted the importance of improving the rights of way to the project as a whole. The importance of ensuring that due diligence has been followed and in trying to negotiate the optimal conditions for the University was acknowledged.

The Provost welcomed Mr Empey and Mr Clark to the meeting. Mr Empey invited the Board members attention to his presentation, dated 23 October 2019, which had been circulated. He provided Board members with an update on progress made to date in respect of the university's 38 sustainability targets. He also summarised some of the issues associated with the collection of data to underpin the report and summarised

the recommendations contained within.

In response to comments from a Board member, it was noted that there are other actions that may be taken by the Schools which would help reduce the university's carbon footprint and that there are many opportunities for Trinity to lead out on.

Following comments from Board members, it was noted that the number of car parking spaces on the campus have been reduced in recent years and that a significant change would be required to further reduce the use of cars by the College community.
