**A meeting of the University Council was held on Wednesday 11 October 2006 at 11.15 am in the Board Room.**

**Statutory Declaration** Council members attending for the first time made the Statutory Declaration.

**SECTION A**

**CL/06-07/002 Council Membership** The Registrar informed Council of a number of issues that have arisen in respect of Council membership. He noted that the faculty of Arts and Humanities had inadvertently been advised to elect four members to Council instead of two, and that the faculty of Engineering and Systems Sciences had received conflicting instructions on the timeline permitted to carry out elections, and as a result, elections in that Faculty were concluded outside the statutory timeframe. Consequently the two individuals nominated from the Faculty of Engineering and Systems Science are not entitled to become voting members of Council. Following discussions with all six individuals nominated to Council and the faculty Deans concerned, the Registrar proposed that:

- (i) the Provost use his power under the Statutes to co-opt to Council the two representatives from the Faculty of Engineering and Systems Science as full members for the academic year 2006-07. The Faculty may wish to re-elect these two representatives at the end of the year, or they may be co-opted for another year, and
- (ii) two of the representatives from the Faculty of Arts and Humanities be duly elected to Council and the other two be invited to attend as observers. This membership arrangement should alternate in 2007-08 by the formal resignation of the two members being deemed elected for the current year: these would then have observer status.

The Registrar confirmed that due procedures would be carried out in future years, and noted that the confusion resulted in part from the on-going academic restructuring and the Fellows' rejection of proposals to revise the Statutes in line with the new structures.

Council approved the proposals as presented by the Registrar, and Dr Gibbons and Dr Stuart were co-opted to Council to represent the Faculty of Engineering and Systems Sciences. Council approved the proposal that Dr Parris and Dr Biehler, representing the Faculty of Arts and Humanities, become full members for 2006-07 and Dr Coleman and Dr Adams become observers for 2006-07 and that this arrangement will alternate in 2007-08.

The Provost welcomed all new Council members and observers, those members attending for the first time made the Statutory Declaration.

**CL/06-07/003 Minutes** The Minutes of the meeting of 28 June 2006 were approved and signed.

**CL/06-07/004 Matters Arising from the Minutes** A matter arising from the Minutes was discussed and has been minuted below.

**CL/06-07/005 Academic Restructuring and Governance (see Actum CL/05-06/212 of 28 June 2006)**  
 The Senior Lecturer drew Council's attention to CL/05-06/212, on academic restructuring and governance, and noted that the Board at its meeting of the 5<sup>th</sup> July 2006 approved the establishment of a working group on restructuring with membership representing Board, Council, Heads of School, Faculty Deans and students. A working group has been established and has met once. Its membership comprises the Senior Lecturer (Chair), Dr H Gibbons (Council), Dr V Campbell (Council), Professor O'Halpin (Board), Professor J Parnell (Board), Professor J

Ohlmeyer (Heads), Professor McConnell (Heads), Professor T Brown (Deans), President Students' Union and the Acting Academic Secretary (secretary). The working group will report the outcome of its deliberations to the meeting of Board on the 22<sup>nd</sup> November 2006 for decision at the meeting of the 12<sup>th</sup> December 2006. The group will agree a process for consultation at its next meeting on the 18<sup>th</sup> October 2006.

**CL/06-07/006 Provost's Report** The Provost drew Council's attention to the programme for 2006-07 which was discussed at the Board meeting of the 27<sup>th</sup> September 2006. He noted the need for the university to focus on external opportunities and threats, on reaching stability internally on structures, on staff recruitment and the ARAM, and on concluding academic reorganisation. He commented that discussions on the reorganisation of administrative and support services have been delayed until a decision on the final configuration of academic structures is made. The formation of clusters of schools will enable decisions to be made on ARAM refinement, planning, staff recruitment and retention, devolution of decision making and budgeting. It is envisaged that if a small number of clusters are formed, the head of each cluster will become part of the Provost's management team. It is planned to make decisions on 2007-08 staff recruitment in December 2006 using 04-05 ARAM data, and in June 2007 for 2008-09 recruitment based on 2005-06 ARAM data. The Provost noted plans to invest in twenty new blood academic positions and stressed the importance of these being allied to clusters. It is anticipated that national funding to advance the 4<sup>th</sup> level agenda and research will be forthcoming, but bids to such funds will be extremely competitive. There is great potential for College to explore funding from Irish philanthropic sources. The Trinity Foundation generates approximately €15 million annually for an investment of €1.5 million. Securing philanthropic funding is highly dependent on Schools engaging with the Foundation, philanthropists, and other potential donors. In conclusion, the Provost noted the importance of taking an integrated approach to implementing ARAM, securing new blood positions, establishing clusters of schools, reorganising administrative and support services, and implementing appropriate governance models including reviewing the role of Academic Officers and senior Administrators.

Following observations on the new blood positions and the need for a speedy decision on the final phase of academic restructuring and administrative reorganisation, Council noted the programme for 2006-07.

**CL/06-07/007 Interdisciplinary and Service Teaching** A report from the working group of the Heads' Committee on interdisciplinary and service teaching dated May 2006 was circulated. Professor P Walsh, chair of this group, introduced the report, noting the working group's membership and the terms of reference, and thanking members for their work and especially Ms E Hayes, Senior Lecturer's Office, who acted as secretary to the group. The report outlines the extent of existing interdisciplinary and service teaching activity in College, addressing issues relating to ARAM, the Two-subject Moderatorship programme and the Broad Curriculum initiative. It examines conventions for inter-school cooperation on undergraduate teaching, addressing immediate and long-term challenges, disciplinary boundaries and responsibilities, and recommends good practice guidelines for course delivery.

Interdisciplinary courses are defined as those courses where a number of disciplines, both within and across Schools/Faculties are involved in the delivery of a programme with considerable input from each discipline. The disciplines involved are more or less equal partners and the programme is managed in the form of a committee with representation from all partners. Service teaching occurs when a course provider contracts another College discipline to provide teaching on the programme for which that School has the most appropriate expertise. The report proposes, among other

things, that for both interdisciplinary and service teaching, clear parameters should be agreed between the relevant parties regarding mode of delivery, the staff involved in the teaching and assessment of a course, and assessment arrangements.

There is currently a high level of interdisciplinary teaching across programmes, approximately 66% of undergraduate FTSEs (full-time student equivalents) and 15% of postgraduate FTSEs are in respect of either interdisciplinary courses or courses which have a service teaching element. Professor Walsh noted issues in respect of teaching activities undertaken by non-College staff, such as staff from other third level institutions and visiting academics, and postgraduate students, as well as issues in respect of ARAM and underlying strategic objectives of the College. He took the meeting through the proposed guidelines for good academic practice in course delivery, noting in particular a guiding principle that a School should have overall responsibility for the design and delivery of its curricula, but that any measure proposed by a School on purely financial grounds which has a demonstrably detrimental effect on another School would not be acceptable. Where a School wishes to include a curriculum element on a course for which it does not itself have staff with the academic background and expertise, it should in the first instance approach the relevant disciplinary areas in College to ascertain whether they would be in a position to offer or contribute to the offering of a course. Only when this avenue is exhausted, should the employment of external teaching be considered. He noted the importance of the driver for the reflection of teaching activities being accurate, and proposed that the FTSE calculations should be based on the ECTS credit applied at the module level within courses. Professor Walsh commented on the role of postgraduate students in the delivery of undergraduate courses, and stressed the importance of proper supervision, adding that existing guidelines in this regard may need to be reviewed.

In conclusion, Professor Walsh commented on the requirement for central regulation on procedures relating to interdisciplinary and service teaching and added that an alternative to regulation might be a modular course structure that facilitated common entry into a discipline, as currently exists for BESS and Science, allowing students to build their degree programme according to modules offered by different Schools with appropriate prerequisites according to the mode of study chosen.

The Provost thanked Professor Walsh for chairing the group and noted his appreciation to the working group for their contribution to this very important issue. He commented on the extent of interdisciplinary activity across College which attests to, among other things, the existence of extensive integration of undergraduate curricula. Council discussed the report and noted the importance of all staff involved in teaching a course being represented on the course committee as well as the need for regulation of procedures, especially in the ARAM environment.

The view was expressed that postgraduate students benefit from having access to teaching practice and the attendant fee which helps to finance their studies.

Following clarification on a number of points, Council noted the report on interdisciplinary and service teaching. It was agreed that the Senior Lecturer would distil from the report and discussions to-date a number of principles for recommendation to a future meeting of Council.

**CL/06-07/008 School of Histories and Humanities – Semester Start-up Programme** A memorandum dated 29<sup>th</sup> September 2006 from the Head of the School of Histories and Humanities was circulated with papers for the meeting. The Senior Lecturer introduced this item. The semester start-up programme (SSP) is intended to provide international students with the opportunity to undertake the equivalent of a full semester's study at Trinity College before Christmas. Running annually for four weeks in September, the

programme will integrate with the Michaelmas term to form a thirteen-week semester. The module carries 10 ECTS and comprises three strands covering Irish history, archaeology, art, architecture and literature in a historical context. The SSP which has been approved as part of the School's strategic plan will accommodate a minimum of 35 and a maximum of 70 students.

In considering the proposal Council noted that the Senior Tutor's Office had not been consulted and issues relating to the allocation of tutors, orientation, and student integration would need to be addressed. Council also noted concerns expressed about changes to the teaching timetable and the knock-on effects for staff. It was confirmed that administrative arrangements in respect of registration have been addressed, and it was noted that different start dates were already in place for other courses in College. The Dean of the faculty of Arts and Humanities expressed his support for the proposal and noted that the SSP would be linked to the new Irish Studies undergraduate degree programme that has already been approved by Council and Board.

Council recommended that the School of Histories and Humanities liaise with the Senior Tutor's Office and the Academic Staff Association on the issues raised. Council approved the introduction of the semester start-up programme effective from 2007-08.

**CL/06-07/009 Admissions - Undergraduate Admissions Preliminary Statistics 2006-07** A memorandum dated 2<sup>nd</sup> October 2006 from the Admissions Officer and undergraduate admissions preliminary statistics for 2006-07 were circulated with papers for the meeting. The Admissions Officer introduced this item noting that a full report on the 2006-07 undergraduate admissions will be presented in the Senior Lecturer's Annual Report for discussion by Council towards the end of Michaelmas term.

The 2006-07 applications for entry to undergraduate courses show a decrease of approximately 4.5% on the 2005-06 figures in overall applications to Trinity College. All courses, barring a few exceptions, experienced a drop in applications in 2006. There is a significant difference in the number of total applications and the number of eligible applications to a course. Eligible applications refer to those applications that satisfy College's matriculation requirements and, where applicable, course entry requirements. Depending on the discipline, the percentage difference between total and eligible applications ranges from 23% to 40%. There was an 11% decrease in first preference applications to undergraduate courses at Trinity College in 2006-07 and there is also a significant difference in the number of total first preference applications and the number of eligible first preference applications. The ratio of eligible first preference applications to quota for many courses is less than 1 and this is particularly true for courses in the Faculty of Engineering and Systems Science and the Faculty of Science.

In response to a question, the Admissions Officer commented that the continuing drop in the number of students taking the Leaving Certificate constitutes the principal reason for the overall decline in applications, but the increase in the number of undergraduate degree courses available in the Irish third level sector as well as the purported increase in Leaving Certificate students opting for courses in the UK also contribute to the decline. Competition for the best qualified students is increasing, and it was argued that College should address its communications strategy in time for the February 1<sup>st</sup> CAO deadline. The Provost informed Council that he has set up an advisory group to provide guidance on a wide range of communications issues for the College. Council commented on the importance of disseminating unambiguous information on courses especially in a changing academic environment

It was noted that approximately 10,000 Leaving Certificate examination scripts were rechecked in 2006 of which approximately 2,000 received an upgrade, and the view was expressed that students registered with the University may expect an examination

appeal system that mirrors that of the Leaving Certificate. Information on College's examination appeal system is available in the Calendar and on the Senior Tutor's webpage in 'question and answer' format

Council noted the preliminary statistics for 2006-07 undergraduate admissions.

**CL/06-07/010 Nominations for Appointment** Council noted and approved the circulated information (see Appendices 1-4 to this Minute).

The Dean of Graduate Studies expressed some concern about the recruitment procedures for Associate Research Lecturer and Associate Research Fellow. The Senior Lecturer advised that a sub-group of the Heads' Committee, chaired by the Dean of Graduate Studies, is currently considering a range of academic titles, including Associate Research Lecturer, Associate Research Fellow and Research Fellow, with a view to establishing a College-wide policy for their use. He suggested that this sub-group conclude its deliberations and bring recommendations to the Heads' Committee and to Council as a matter of priority.

1. Applicants will be requested to submit their own peer reviewer assessments with their applications.
2. The applicants will be requested to submit concise summaries of their teaching philosophy. Notes should all be type written, not handwritten
3. The peer reviewers should be asked to submit their summary in typewritten format.
4. The exceptional case which currently allows an application by a Lecturer to Associate Professor should be retained.
5. The entire body of career work should be eligible for review when applying for any promotional grade.



6. In the case of Personal Chairs, a *prima facie* case must first be made to the Sub-Committee of the Senior Promotions Committee before a candidate is shortlisted for interview.
