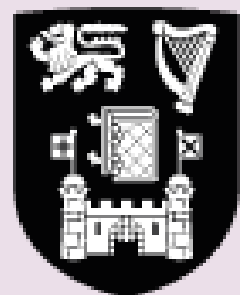

How do I apply for Reasonable Accommodations?

- Log into **my.tcd.ie** using your student number and password.
- Click on the **My Disability Service** tab.
- Click on **Reasonable Accommodations Application**.
- Select your **primary and secondary disability**.
- Choose **Yes** or **No** to receiving exam accommodations.
- Upload **evidence of disability**.

How do I apply for Reasonable Accommodations?



What should I expect from my Needs Assessment?

- You will **get to know your Disability Officer**. They will be your Point of Contact in the Service.
- Discuss **supports** that will **help you succeed** in college.
- Explore **course demands**.
- Review **Exam Accommodations**
- Meetings last around **40 minutes** and can take place online or in-person.
- Following the Needs Assessment, the student's Disability Officer will prepare an individual Learning Educational Needs Summary (**LENS**) Report. The LENS Report details the Reasonable Accommodations to be implemented.

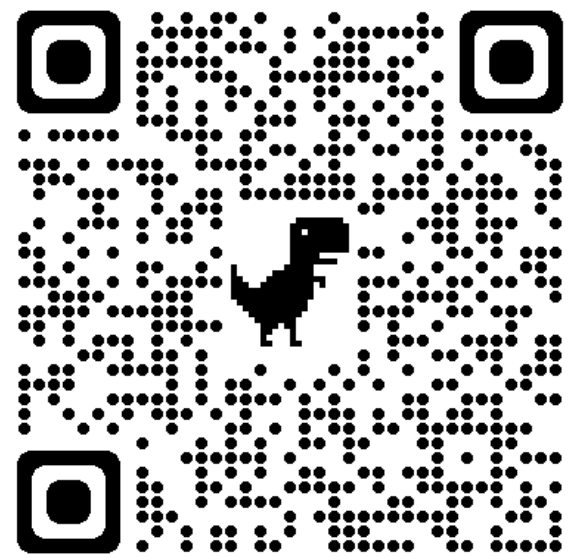


1916 Bursary

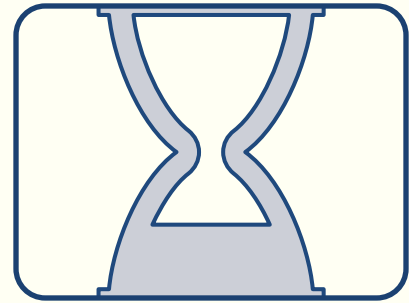


SafeZone

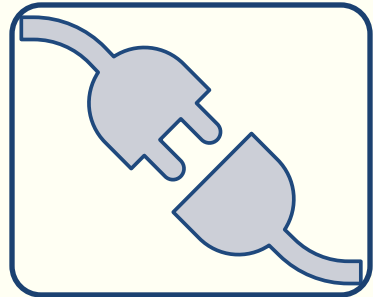
- SafeZone is a safety and security app for Trinity campus.

- The Disability Service have fall alerters that students can borrow. Please request one from your Disability Officer



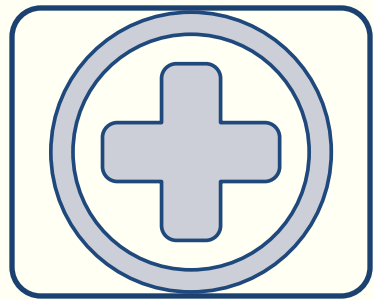

Our Relationship with the DisAbility Service

The Ability Co_Op is the student-led wing of the DisAbility Service.

We keep the service in check. We ask the questions, and remind the service who they're there for- the students!

While the DisAbility Service is part of the Trinity Institution and has to do things strictly by the book, as a student organisation we have more freedom. This manifests in many ways.

Accessibility of our Group



Each meeting is hybrid and has meeting notes.

- . The physical meeting takes place in the An Mheitheal which is wheelchair accessible. It a spacious, general quiet room, with different types of seatings. Fidget toys are provided. Windows can be opened, and HEPA Filters can be booked in advance if required**
- . The online meeting takes place on google meet which provides decent automatic captions. Participation can be done through the google meet chat, or discord (outside meetings) aswell.**

All of our social media has, when applicable, alt-text, captions and accessible font.

If you have any additional accessibility needs or concerns please let us know. While signing up to the co-op, there is a section to add your accessibility needs.

How to Support Us



How to support us as students:

- **Demand inclusion in your academic and non-academic activities. Does your event have wheelchair access? Are your lectures recorded? Ask these questions loudly! We deserve inclusion.**

How to support us as staff:

- **Keep informed about up-to-date procedures for disAbility inclusion on campus.**
- **Talk about disability! Many disabilities are invisible. Remember that just because you can't see that colleagues or students are disabled, they may be. Talking about disability keeps the ideas fresh and reminds us to include everyone.**



The Ability Co_Op is currently heading up a poster campaign that we intend to display across the Trinity College Dublin campus as well as across our social media accounts.

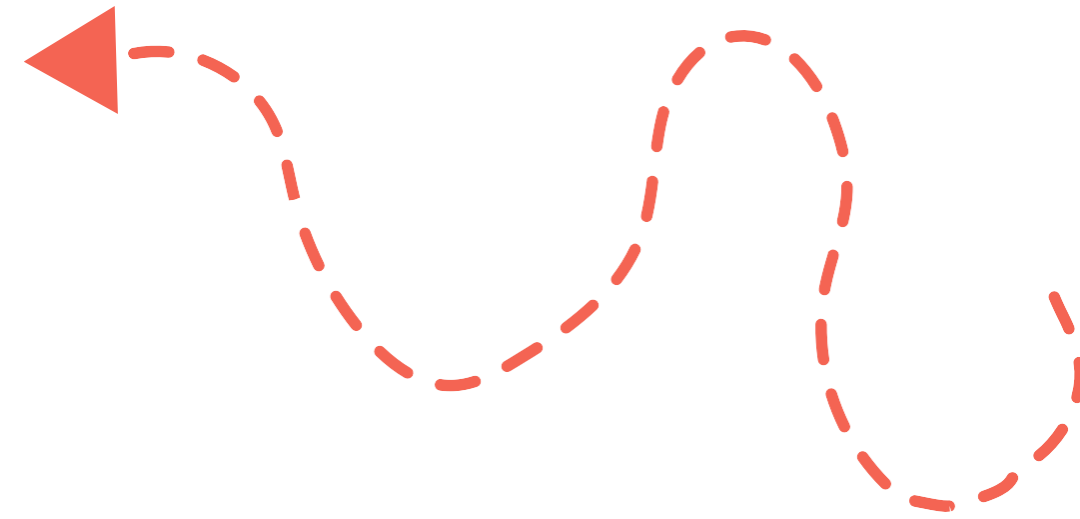
Our Posters aim to provide an insight into the lives of Disabled students and the effects that Disability has on their college lives.

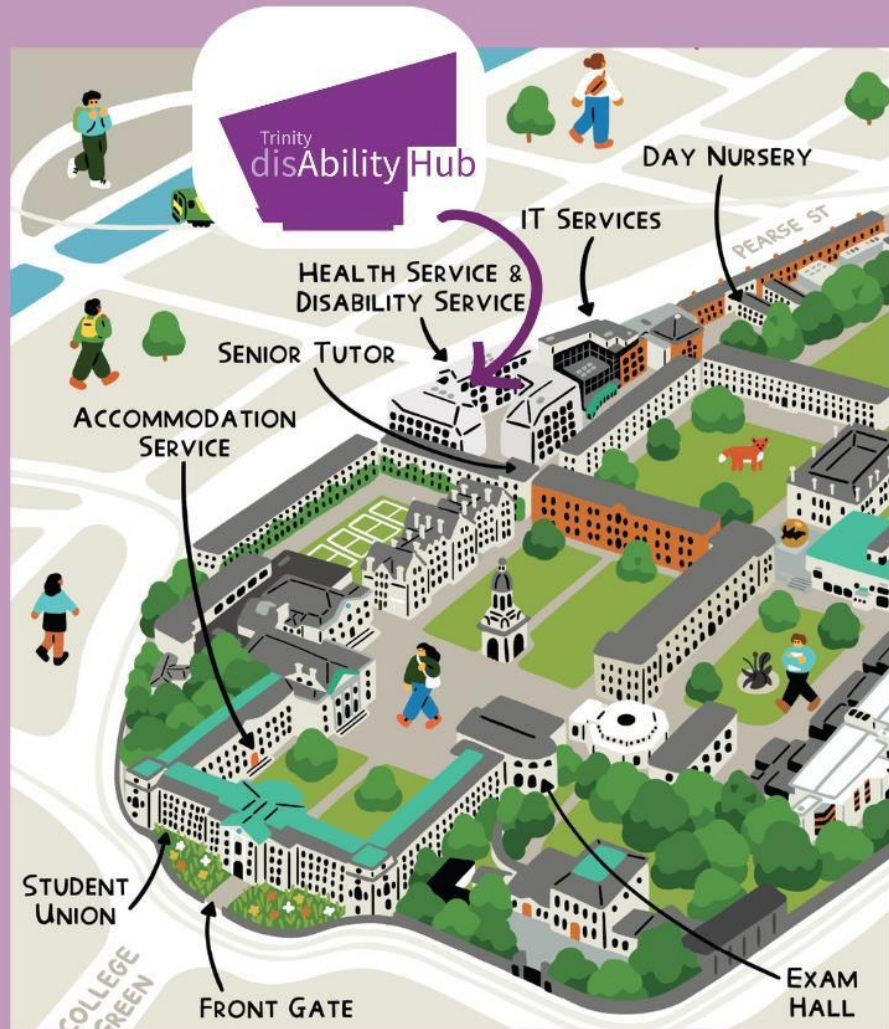

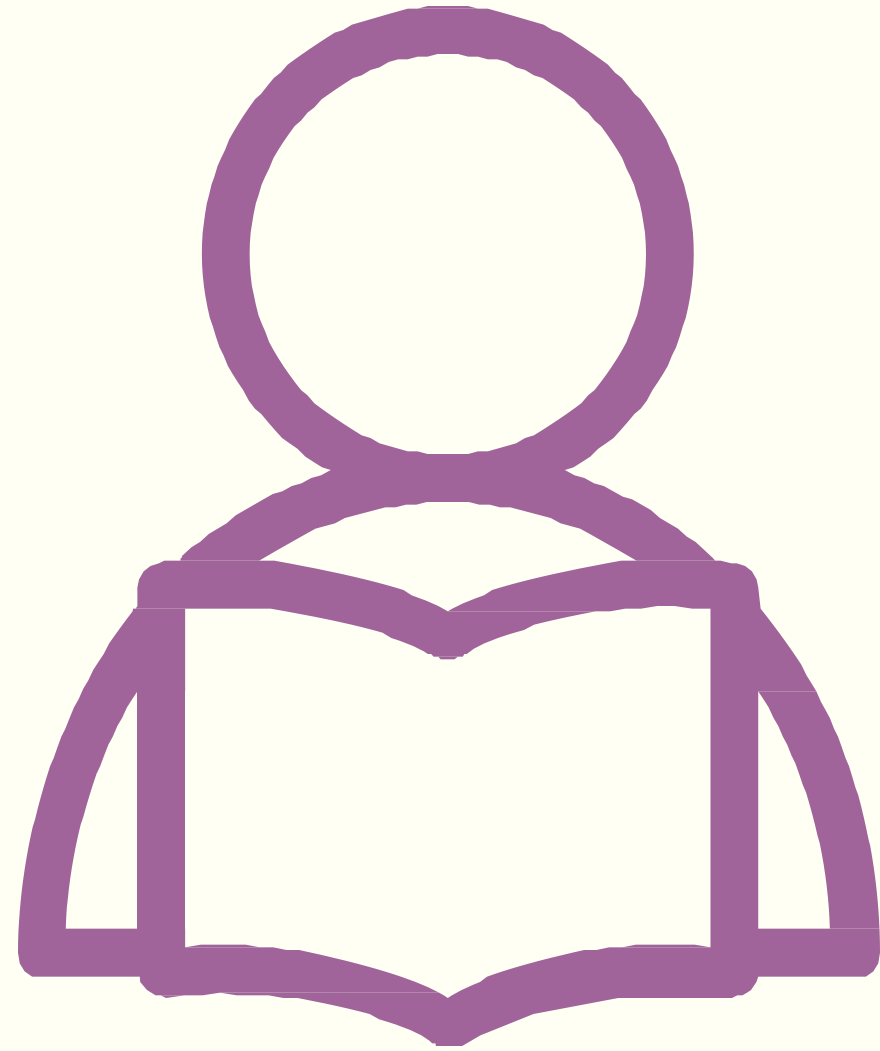

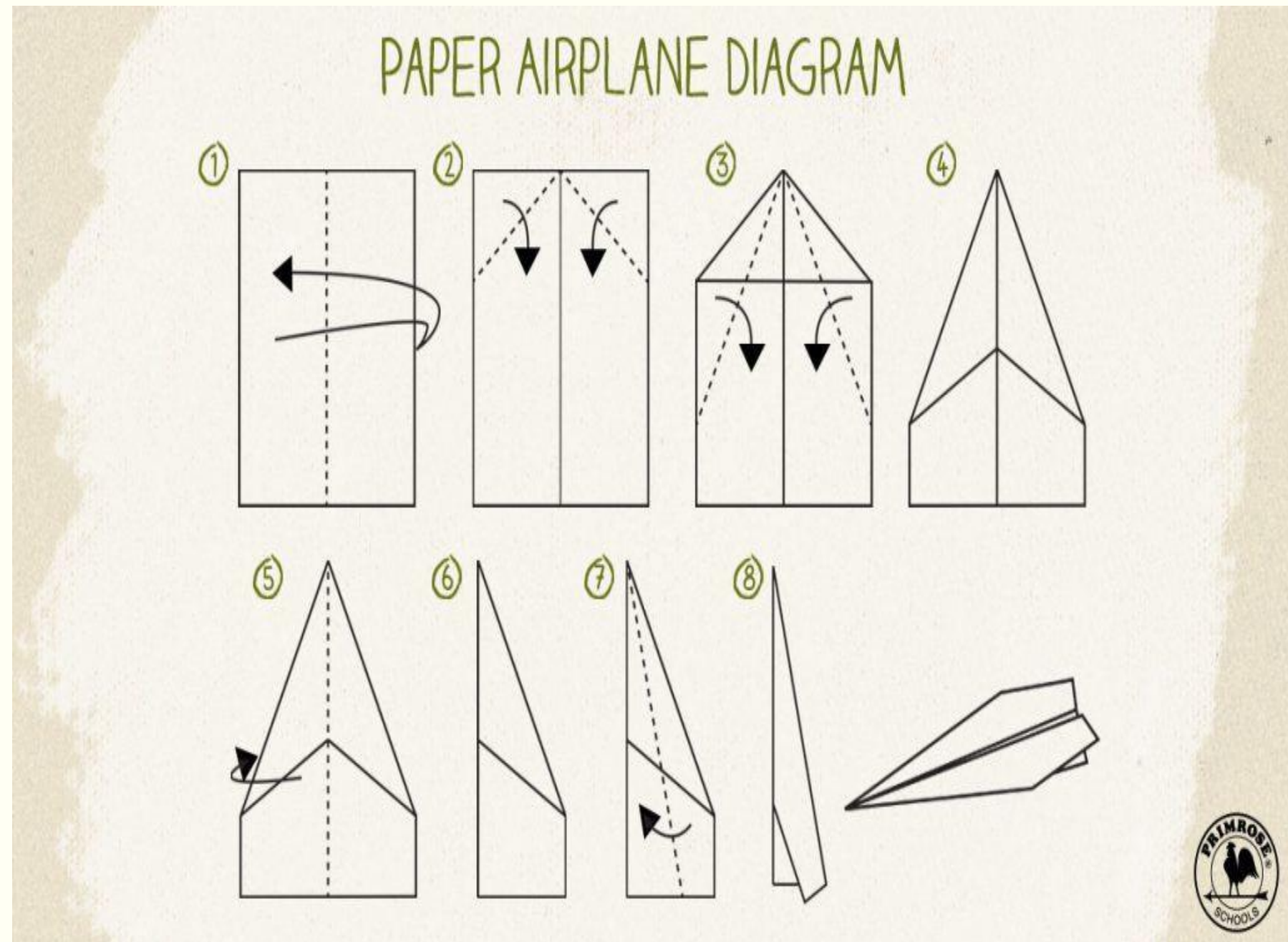
Tie Breaker — Paper Airplane
