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Trinity Inclusive Curriculum Project

- Commenced in October 2020: Year 1: Project defining and development.
- Review of inclusive curriculum literature and >50 consultations with staff and students across the Trinity community, plus external experts.
- Definitions:
 - Curriculum involves both what is to be taught and how it is taught.
 - An inclusive curriculum in which all students, regardless of personal circumstances, or learning backgrounds, abilities or strategies, have equitable opportunity to engage fully in their studies and achieve their learning goals.
- Inclusion is everyone's business whole-college involvement.
- Dynamic nature of diversity and exclusion (COVID-19): students at the centre of Trinity-INC, guiding us with real-ti


Toward meaningful student partnership

- Summer Student Partner Programme 2021
 - Students from backgrounds often underrepresented in and who can face the most barriers in higher education

Values of the Students as Partners model: Flexibility, empathy and respect

Core principles and values of a meaningful partnership (Healy, et al. 2014) to supports us to elevate the student voice and work together to raise awareness or experiences of inclusion and exclusion within teaching and learning at Trinity in a process of co-creation.

Universal Design for Learning to facilitate engagement, promote access, and empower Student Partners to use their voice.



Trinity-INC Student Partner Committee

- Ongoing recruitment (Inclusivity)
- Paid living wage (Empowerment, Responsibility, Reciprocity)
- Flexible engagement opt in / opt out, and options for contribution (Inclusivity / UDL)
- Accessible materials (Inclusivity / UDL)
- Inclusivity commitment stated at the beginning of every meeting (Authenticity, Challenge)
- Cultivating a sense of belonging where students are valued for their contributions. (Community, Trust)
- Never have to be the 'voice', but students are encouraged and supported to use their voices (Authenticity, Responsibility / UDL)
