Post Summary

This position will contribute to the Horizon Europe Innovation Action project CULTIVATE: Co-designing food sharing innovation for resilience led by Prof. Anna Davies and based in Trinity College Dublin. CULTIVATE is a four-year project with 19 partners from across Europe, including food sharing initiatives, local authorities, international networks, creative enterprises and academic institutions. The role will support the expansion of SHARING SOLUTIONS services, including the management and extension of the Food Sharing Map, generating users for The Toolshed Sustainability Impact Assessment (SIA) tool, the Talent Garden, and the Greenhouse chat channel. Activities include conducting a feasibility study for sustaining and expanding the Food Sharing Map, creating a financing plan for CULTIVATE's Food Sharing Compass and contributing to grant proposals supporting the development of SHARING SOLUTIONS services.

Standard Duties and Responsibilities of the Post

The successful candidate will:

- Conduct individual and collaborative research using Sharing Solutions services to the highest ethical standards in a variety of settings, contributing to the CULTIVATE project and associated projects. This will include some international travel for meetings.
- Manage the SHARING SOLUTIONS website, including the Food Sharing Map, Toolshed, Talent Garden & Greenhouse elements.
- Develop post-project sustainability and financing plans for the Food Sharing Map & the CULTIVATE Food Sharing Compass.
- Carry out any administrative work associated with the programme of research and assist with wider project administration when required.
- Identify suitable funding opportunities and co-develop grant applications to support the maintenance and extension of SHARING SOLUTIONS services beyond CULTIVATE.
- Engage in the dissemination of the results from research to stakeholders in the appropriate form (e.g. presentations, publications, blogs, newspaper articles etc.).

The Selection Process in Trinity

The Selection Committee (Interview Panel) may include members of the Academic and Administrative community together with External Assessor(s) who are expert in the area. Applications will be acknowledged by email. If you do not receive confirmation of receipt within 1 day of submitting your application online, please contact the named hiring lead on the job specification immediately and prior to the closing date/time.

Given the degree of co-ordination and planning to have a Selection Committee available on the specified date, the University regrets that it may not be in a position to offer alternate selection dates. Where candidates are unavailable, reserves may be drawn from a shortlist.

Outcomes of interviews are notified in writing to candidates and are issued no later than 5 working days following the selection day.

The Selection Committee may avail of telephone or video conferencing or in person interview. The University's selection methods may consist of any or all of the following: Interviews, Presentations, Psychometric Testing, References and Situational Exercises.

It is the policy of the University to conduct pre-employment medical screening/full pre-employment medicals. Information supplied by candidates in their application (Cover Letter and CV) will be used to shortlist for interview.
