Structure and delivery

Year One: commences with a full week in September and thereafter one or two days per week for the remainder of the academic year (depending on whether the course is being undertaken full-time or part-time).

Year Two: attendance at workshops throughout the academic year. A blended (online and face to face) learning approach is utilised in the delivery of theoretical content which includes lectures, group discussions and self-directed learning. Entry Requirements:

The criteria for admission are that the candidate must

- currently engaged in the mental health / mental illness field
- normally hold an honours degree in a relevant discipline or otherwise satisfy the selection panel that they have the ability to complete and benefit from the programme
