Guidelines for Student Colloquium abstract submission

The Student Colloquium is for early career researchers currently undertaking a Master's in Research or a PhD in an area relevant to the topics provided. **This colloquium is for "work in progress" only**. Completed research should be submitted for THEconf2026 Research Conference.

Authors submitting abstracts for review should read the guidelines carefully and ensure they are adhered to. Relevant headings should be used throughout your abstract and allowance will be made for these headings in the word count.

Applicants may submit more than one abstract for review.

- Title of abstract (no more than 150 characters);
- Word limit: 300 words (this does not include the abstract title and section headings);
- The abstract should not include references;
- Use the headings listed below (see Content of Abstract);
- To facilitate the blind review process, individuals and institutions should not be identified in the body of the abstract; e.g. use 'author's institution' instead of using the name of the company, university or hospital.

Successful applicants will have the opportunity to update this information prior to the conference.

Content of Abstract

The abstracts for this Student Colloquium are peer reviewed and available online post-conference, as submitted. By submitting to the colloquium, the author hereby affirms that the work submitted is theirs, original and recent.

Abstracts should use the following headings:

- Background to study.
- Aims and objectives of both the study and the presentation.
- Methodology.
- Preliminary findings and implications to practice / progress to date.
- Conclusion and relevance.
