Doctorate in Clinical Psychology (D. Clin. Psych.)

Applications are invited for the Doctorate in Clinical Psychology in Trinity College Dublin, a three-year full-time professional training degree in clinical psychology run in partnership with the Health Service Executive. **Applications are open from 1st November.** The course is currently accredited by the Psychological Society of Ireland (PSI). A limited number of places are available for the 2025-2028 course.

Currently postgraduate students on this course are employed by the Health Service Executive on the Trainee Psychologist salary scale and in addition have a contribution towards fees paid on their behalf. This funding is not available to those wishing to upgrade their existing training/qualification in clinical psychology. The course does not accept self-funded applications. Graduates of the course will undertake to work in the Irish health services for a three-year period following completion of the course.

At the time of application, candidates must hold a minimum of an upper second class honours primary degree or an appropriate conversion degree (NFQ Level 8) in Psychology, making them eligible for Graduate membership of the PSI. As part of that degree, candidates must have completed an empirical study in psychology. In addition, candidates must have six months full-time paid or voluntary employment in an organisation that provides clinical experience involving direct client contact and the role held by the applicant must involve the provision of direct care to individuals who comprise the population associated with using clinical psychology services, or equivalent part-time experience. Experience gained in a research capacity is explicitly excluded. This experience must be gained subsequent to the completion of the qualification that confers eligibility for graduate membership of the Psychological Society of Ireland and within the five years immediately prior to the closing date for applications. Applicants must have access to appropriate transport in order to fulfill the requirements of the role.

The application fee is non-refundable, and candidates are advised to make themselves available on the notified date for assessment. Inability to attend the assessment on the designated date will not constitute grounds for a refund of the application fee.
