





Module Enrolment Amendment Period 13th – 31st January

- Your course load will depend on how many ECTS you need to take to satisfy you home university's credit requirements.
- You must take a <u>minimum 0f 20 ECTS</u> per semester, <u>45 ECTS for full year.</u>
- You can take a <u>maximum of 30 ECTS</u> per semester.
- You must take <u>50% minimum</u> of your ECTS in your host department (specified on your acceptance letter).
- Speak to departmental Erasmus coordinators for advice on courses. (AR is responsible for admin process only)



Erasmus Grant

Your Grant is managed and paid by your home university.

- Sign and submit your documents on time.
- If there are problems with your payment then check with your home university.



- The sooner they have the paperwork done the quicker you'll get your grant.
- Most of you won't need to open Irish bank accounts
- Confirmation of Arrival, email <u>erasmus.incoming@tcd.ie</u>
- Learning Agreement signed by departmental Erasmus coordinator


"I made friends for life and hope I can visit again soon"


"Registering for classes was stressful for me at my host university."

- Emphasis on Independent Learning
- Different types of classes include: lectures in theatres, tutorials in smaller groups to discuss the lecture, seminar classes which combine the two

- Lots of resources through the TCD Library to help with referencing, research resources. The staff in the library are there to help and guide you.
