



What is the T Fund?

- Students are able to apply for gender affirming items such as binders, gaffs, makeup, clothes, etc.
- The T Fund committee meets once every term to allocate money to the applicants
- There is €1000 for each term, and a limit of €200 per student.
- The members of the committee include the auditor of QSoc, the QSoc inclusion officer, the LGBTRO, and an external person from a trans organisation



Safe Practices in Dublin

Dublin is rather safe for Queer students. Common sense is the main consideration.

On a night out:

- -- Make sure you know how you're getting home before you go out, have a plan, don't plan to walk home at 4 am alone.
- -- If you're going to a stranger's house, make sure to let someone know, send the address and make sure they know when to check in if you haven't messaged again.
- -- Don't do anything if your gut tells you isn't safe.

Safer Sex:

- -- Both the SU and QSoc keep free Condoms, Dental Dams and Lube handy if you need any— don't hesitate!
- College Health also does confidential STI tests for students
- There are a number of national resources for free HIV testing, at-home STI testing, and PrEP



Safe Practices in Dublin

While Dublin doesn't have the biggest drug scene compared to other European Cities, all Drug safety tips still apply:

Drug safety

- -- Don't take something if you don't know what it is.
- -- Don't take something for the first time when you're out.
- -- Be aware of common signs of spiking in drinks:
- Drink looks foggier with excessive bubbles & ice doesn't float
- Change in taste or colour
- Unexpected intoxication or breathing issues

Needle Spiking:

While rare, be aware of needle spiking! People now spike using needles

If you suspect needle spiking:

- Bleed the puncture by squeezing around it
- Wash with soap under warm water
- Cover with dressing if possible
- -Report ASAP and seek medical help


