Application for Trinity Research Doctorate (Sanctuary) Award 2025-26 APPLICANT FORM

Applications are sought for **1** Trinity Research Doctorate (Sanctuary) Award.

Application Process

Part 1 – for admission to the full-time PhD Register

If you are considering making an application as a student of sanctuary for the Trinity Research Doctorate Award in 2025-26, you **must** also apply for admission to the full-time PhD register in Trinity via my.tcd.ie as normal (please note that there is a non-refundable online application fee of €55 per application).

Applicants **must** liaise directly with the potential Principal Supervisor before application for admission to the PhD register. The supervisor will guide the applicant through the Trinity PhD formal application process. The applicant should advise the Academic Registry that they intend making application as a student of sanctuary for the Trinity Research Doctorate Award and should be in receipt of an unconditional offer before April 1 (subject to satisfying admission requirements).

Part 2 – for the Trinity Research Doctorate (Sanctuary) Award

Once applicants have an offer for admission to the full-time PhD register at Trinity, the following is required:

- a) the applicant must complete **this** application form applying for the Trinity Research Doctorate (Sanctuary) Award, and
- b) their named Principal Supervisor must complete the required supervisor form at <https://forms.office.com/e/JHQ1dx8zPS>. (Note: access to this form is restricted to Trinity staff.) The Supervisor should complete the required template no later than Tuesday, April 8, 2025.

Eligibility

Applicants to the Trinity Research Doctorate (Sanctuary) Award must satisfy the following eligibility criteria:

1. Applicants **must** be residing in the Republic of Ireland.
2. Applicants **must** currently be in the international protection system, temporary protection, seeking asylum, or have refugee status or permission to remain in Ireland on humanitarian grounds.
3. Applicants **must** receive an unconditional offer for admission **by the deadline of April 1, 2025** to the full-time PhD register in Trinity College Dublin with support of the intended Principal Supervisor. This implies that applicants will have met all academic requirements including English language requirements.

Failing to meet any of the above criteria will result in your application not being considered.

Required Documents

Following successful online submission of the application form, you will be provided with a link to an online folder to upload documentation confirming your legal / immigration status. The online application will be deemed complete **after** the subsequent submission of the required documents. Only complete applications will be given consideration by the Evaluation Panel.

Evaluation Process

Each completed application will be reviewed and scored by internal cross-faculty reviewers on the basis of the full evaluation criteria. Thereafter, short-listed applications will be evaluated, on the basis of the full evaluation criteria, by a panel, chaired by the Dean of Graduate Studies, to include the Chair of the University of Sanctuary Steering Committee, an academic representative from each Faculty, and representatives of Trinity Global, and the Irish Refugee Council (or similar).

Shortlisted applicants may be invited to interview, to be determined by the Evaluation Panel. The decision as to which application will receive the Trinity Research Doctorate (Sanctuary) Award is at the sole discretion of the Evaluation Panel whose decision on the matter is final.

All applicants will be contacted by the Dean of Graduate Studies on completion of the evaluation process.

Note: unsuccessful applicants to the Trinity Research Doctorate (Sanctuary) Award, who are in receipt of an unconditional offer, will remain eligible for admission to the PhD register and may be considered for other available awards (as appropriate).

Evaluation Criteria

The applications will be scored out of a total of **100 marks** and allocated across four categories as follows:

- **30 marks** for the quality of research design and methodology.
- **25 marks** for research impact including overall significance and degree of innovation of the project. Note: It will be a requirement to evidence consideration has been given to the project's contribution towards enhancing our local and global social and sustainability ambitions. This element will not be weighted but is a mandatory requirement in each application.
- **25 marks** for evidence of support of the supervisor and appropriate supervision supports for the applicant.
- **20 marks** for evidence related to the impact of an award on the student's research trajectory.

PRELIMINARY ELIGIBILITY REVIEW

The information you input in this section will determine your eligibility to apply for the 2025/26 Student of Sanctuary Trinity Research Doctorate Award. If you do not meet the preliminary eligibility criteria, your application will be deemed ineligible and will not be reviewed further. Applicants should note that they are also required to meet the eligibility criteria for admission to the full-time PhD register at Trinity.

If it becomes apparent at any stage of the application, assessment, or award offer process that an applicant does not meet the stated eligibility criteria, or the criteria for admission to the PhD register, an application will be deemed ineligible and any award offer shall be withdrawn.
